



2007 - 2011 Product Comparison (Violin bows)

Cadenza gold:

Similar beauty of sound and power can be found in a typical **~S7~** bow, which is silver mounted and lower priced. The same outfit comes in an **~S8~**, which is more expensive and draws a sweeter and stronger sound.

Cadenza silver:

Except for the inlaid silver ring in the frog, the **~S6~** is very similar both in the outfit and in the sound, at a lower price.

Concerto:

Resonance quality and outfit is exactly the same in the **~S5~**, at a lower price point.

Sinfonia:

The **~S4~** is available in limited quantity, otherwise it is very similar except for the snakewood frog instead of ebony, and a lower price. Alternatively we recommend the **~P4~**, which is a little more heavy.

For any violin with a rather bright sound, the bows of the P-Series are recommended in similar classification. Many orchestra players also prefer the somewhat higher weight and the less dominant sound of the P-Series.

Allegro:

The **~M4~** comes in the same outfit and sounds similar, but the stick is more resilient which makes it much more suitable to good players.

Veloce:

The **~M3~** has almost the same nickel-outfit but is much improved in the playing properties and feel. The winding is now stainless steel.

Vega:

The **~E4~** is almost exactly the same bow, only at a lower price.
